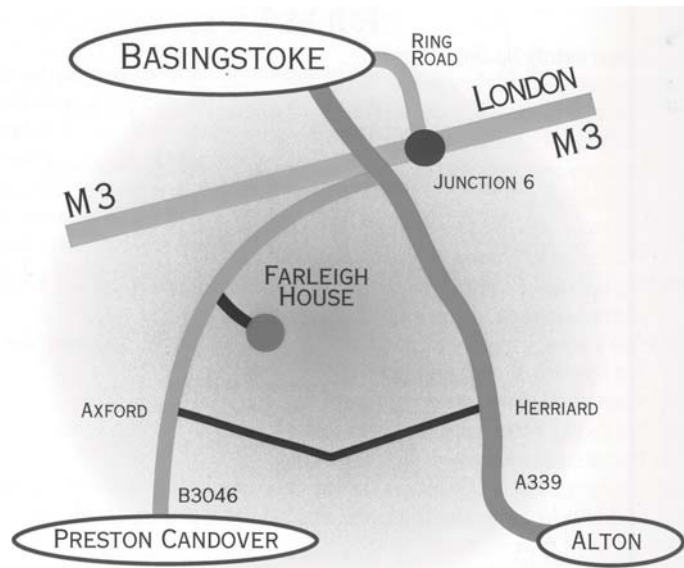


# Farleigh House Charity Ride

## DIRECTIONS

**FROM M3** exit at Junction 6. Take directions to Alton A339. After coming under M3 bridge, turn right for Preston Candover B3046. Go through Cliddesden then 1.5 miles on, turn left to Farleigh Wallop.

**FROM ALTON** go north on A339, approaching Basingstoke before passing under M3 turn left for Cliddesden on B3046. Pass through Cliddesden then 1.5 miles on, turn left to Farleigh Wallop.

**FROM PRESTON CANDOVER** go north towards Basingstoke, after 5 miles turn right to Farleigh Wallop.

## THE RIDE

This unique ride starts in the grounds of Farleigh House and covers 7.5 miles around the Farleigh Estate. Ride across the glorious Hampshire countryside in an area not normally open to the public and enjoy jumping some optional cross country fences located along the route.

The entrance to the event will be signed from the B3046 (Preston Candover - Basingstoke Road) and the A339 (Alton - Basingstoke Road). Ample parking is provided for all vehicles in the park below the house.

## THE CHARITIES

**Riding for the Disabled** (reg. charity no: 1073726) uniquely provides a sport and recreation for adults and children with disabilities. Even those with severe physical and mental disabilities are able to participate. They particularly benefit from the exercise of riding and being stimulated by the sense of achievement.

**Basingstoke NeighbourCare** (reg. charity no: 1067729) is a charity helping the people of Basingstoke by offering care and assistance to anyone in need. They seek to complete simple tasks for people, old or young, able or disabled, using a team of volunteers. Anyone in need can make the call.

**St John Ambulance** (reg. charity no: 1077265/1) trains people in first aid and ambulance skills. People can come along to learn a variety of skills and make new friends and use these skills as first aiders or ambulance crew at public events, particularly equestrian events. Nationally, St John Ambulance has 45,000 volunteers and five million hours of service are given to the community each year.

## RULES

1. **Sorry, strictly No Dogs Allowed.**
2. Horses/ponies must be 4 years or more.
3. Riders are to obtain a starting number (£2 non-refundable deposit) from the secretary's tent on arrival.
4. Hard hats or jockey's skull caps (to British Standard PAS015 or EN1384 or equivalent) must be worn. Body protectors are strongly recommended.
5. The course is to be ridden in pairs or larger groups where possible.
6. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.
7. The ride may be ridden at any safe pace. All the obstacles are optional and any or all may be omitted.
8. Only 3 attempts are allowed at each obstacle, after 3 refusals the rider must omit that jump and continue the course.
9. Riders must keep to the marked course.
10. The decision of the committee on any matter is final.
11. The instructions of stewards and officials must be obeyed.
12. The Farleigh House Charity Ride Committee and the landowners accept no liability for any damage or injury to person, horse or property of riders or spectators, however caused.
13. All participants must have valid third party liability insurance.
14. Please take all litter home with you and remove droppings from the car park.
15. Riding conduct. Participants are asked:
  - to ride courteously, with consideration for other users of the countryside, at the right speed for the terrain, informing riders ahead of overtaking and only overtaking in trot, taking extra care in woodland.
  - not to attempt any jump which they are not confident of clearing.
  - not to smoke on the course, because of fire risk.
  - to look around them and enjoy the scenery!

*Rosettes will be awarded to all Ride participants on return of starting numbers.*
